UPDATES & CHANGES	DNS gave updates on new Admissions Care Plans which reflect an individual's home routine as survey emphasis is on personal preference. Other topics included demonstation of needed skills for competency of care, psychotropic medication evaluation, admission/readmission rates, classification of Medicaid payments, establishment of an ethics committee, infection control and prevention and the renumeration of F-tags. Staff must also demonstrated that they knowledgeable of new CMS regulations in realtion to health.	Info

SGTMJ MCHUGH STRATEGIC PLAN SOLAR ENERGY	A Veterans' Appreciation Day at the Home was also discussed. Board support and presence were requested for all events. The Strategic Plan needs to be formalized and clearly defined then presented to the Board for a vote of approval. The proposal for solar power on the VVH grounds by EnCore, presented by Mr. Dunn, was discussed. Contract specifications, placement on the grounds, maintenance of roads and equipment, financial aspects (energy credits, monetary savings and energy efficiency) and long range considerations were expressed concerns. The Energy subcommittee was tasked to consult a professional familiar with solar contracts about cost/benefits of the project and to investigate other solar energy companies.
